President's Report

January has seen an increase in Covid cases here at The Wells and the rest of Maricopa County. Please continue to follow safe practices when you are out in the Community and if you feel sick stay home. Once again, I would like to mention the **3 T's** which include giving of your: Time, Talent & Treasure. We have so many committees and volunteers giving of their **3 T's** to keep the Community in such great shape and help manage our finances. I have been a bit reluctant to single out any groups or individuals but I do have to give a big **THANK YOU** to The Wells "construction crews" doing all of the landscaping projects around the HOA Office and the expansion of the Golf cart parking.

The 2022 Resident Directories have been distributed. If you still need yours please go to the HOA Office and pick one up. It was noticed on the Monday night of the 1st distribution that at least 3 directories were missing the last 2 pages of the book. At least 6 vendor's paid for ads were excluded from these 3 books. So check your new Resident Directory, specially if you picked yours up on Monday afternoon (January 17th). If you are missing these 2 pages return your book for a replacement at the HOA Office.

A couple of items concerning dumpsters. There is now a sign on the North most dumpster in the West parking lot restricting construction and remodeling waste from this dumpster and only allowing household waste in this dumpster. And we have been working with Sunshine Acres to get a **RECYCLE** dumpster for aluminum cans, which is limited to only pop & beer cans. Steel & tins cans would be excluded, including most soup, vegetable, and juice cans. This would be a small step in recycling and also will support Sunshine Acres.

We are planning on street crack filling some time in February. More details to follow once we get closer to this maintenance project.

Finally, there has been a lot of discussion on removing some or all of the Pine trees along the North side of the Clubhouse. The BOD and the Buildings & Grounds Committee are looking for input form the Community on this topic. *Jim Riedl, The Wells Board President*



The 2022 Wells HOA Election is Tuesday, February 1, 2022. Polls will be open from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM in the conference room of the clubhouse. There are two (2) positions open for the Wells HOA Board of Directors.

Candidates: Nancy York – Lot 460, Marjorie Lesnever – Lot 156.

Board Members are elected for a three-year term and there are no term limits. Only one ballot per lot. (For example: If you own a lot jointly with another person, you are entitled to one ballot only.) Owners in arrears in payment of any amount due the HOA for 30 days or more shall have their voting rights suspended. (Reference CC&Rs Section 5.4)

The clubhouse will be closed to all other activities on Election Day.

In compliance with Article 5, Section 3 of the current CC&R's concerning voting rights for unit owned by family trusts, corporations, or limited liability companies, owners falling into this category were sent a Voter Eligibility Letter the end of November 2021. There were over 50 responses (out of 107), and the election committee thanks you as it makes our job much easier on election day.

Below is the percentage of community involvement in past elections. Let us **all** show our support for the candidates by casting our vote.
